

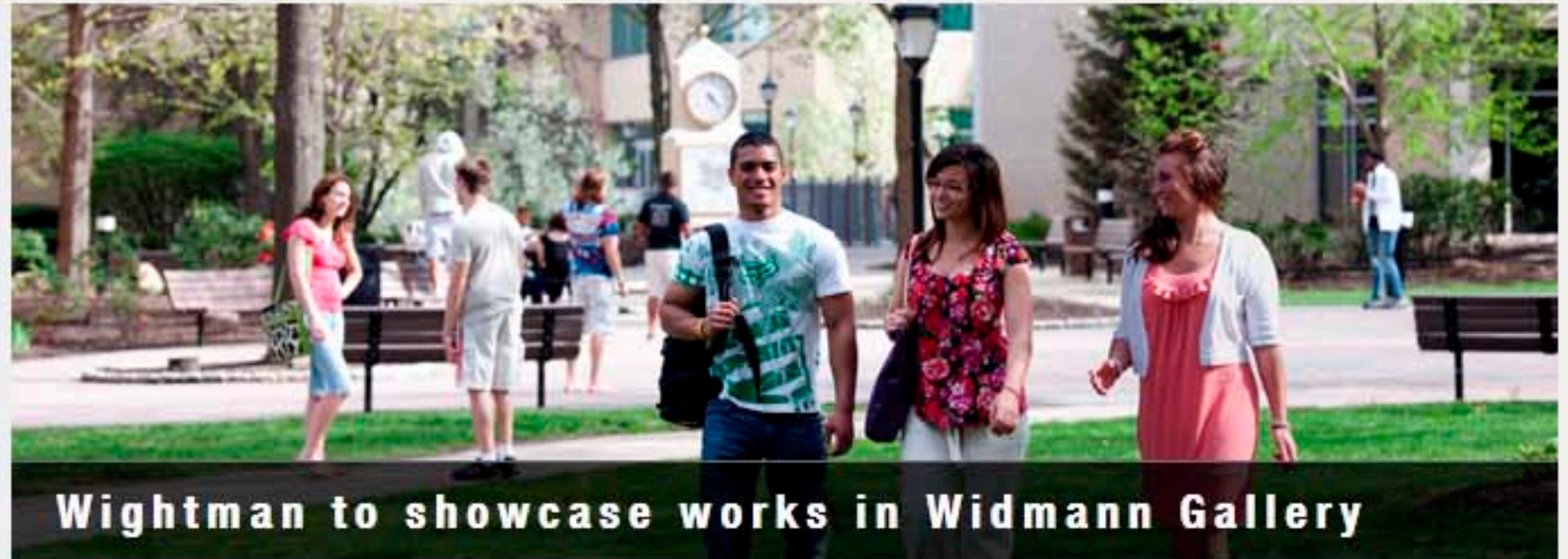

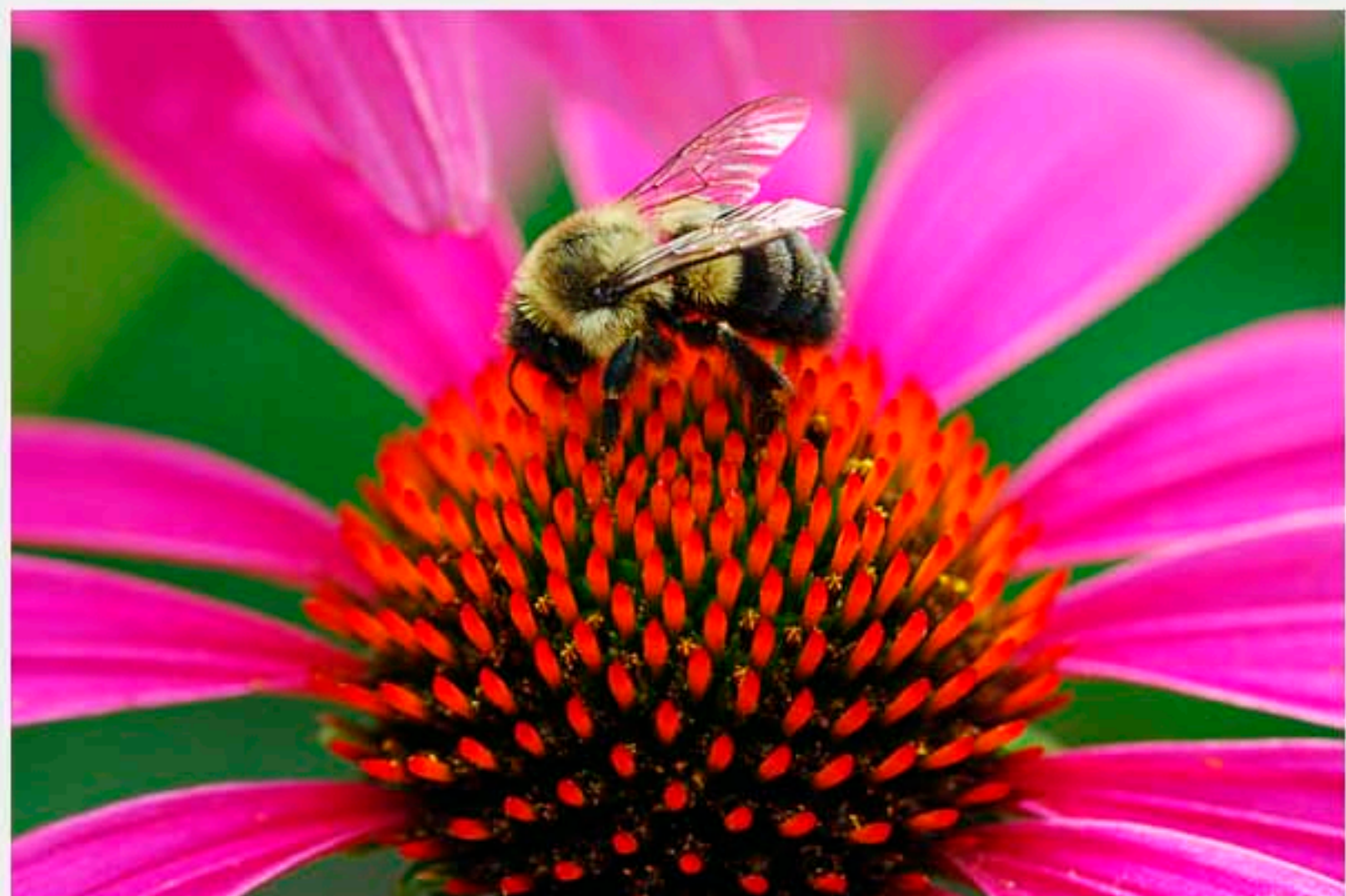

She will display a variety of landscape, wildlife and macro photographs in the "Small Side of Life" exhibition from Jan. 9 through Feb. 23 in the Widmann Gallery at King's College.
